The quality of the instruction was high. Professor Hartel provided a nice balance of student-lead discussions and her own insights on the course material. I felt like I had a lot of ownership over my learning in this course, mainly because she allowed students to take on a leadership role (seminar-style).

My only feedback is that I would have preferred more guidelines on the course assignments. I acknowledge that the instructions for the research project were intentionally loose, so as to allow students to pursue potentially creative and innovative projects. However, when I received feedback on the first assignment, I was unaware that there were certain expectations that I had not met (eg: the introduction did not include a description of why I am interested in this particular research). Although I agreed with the feedback, it would have been preferable to know what was expected beforehand. In the future, I would suggest offering more guidelines on the project- specifically, what elements are expected in each

section.

I really enjoyed this course! Professor Hartel makes the learning experience both enjoyable and rewarding. I appreciated her clarification at the beginning that it's ok to look at the material from a position of comprehension rather than critique all the time. I also really liked the idea of the final project. The one thing I would say is that this project was quite large in scope - I felt like I could have completed an entire PhD on the topic I chose and this made it quite challenging to turn it into a manageable final paper. But really nice to have a chance to do original research for a change!

Oh one other small thing - I think she needs to clarify the weird pass/fail portion of the grade more clearly next time. Class discussion leads appeared to be much more work than individual presentations. Would recommend choosing one or the other, or at least having it more solidly planned out before starting the semester. But otherwise this was a great class!

Jenna Hartel is the most dedicated and passionate instructor I have ever had. Not only is she incredibly enthusiastic about the topics she teachers, she clearly knows her stuff. She pays careful attention to both comprehension and critical thinking, which is a surprising combination - there is a trend in university courses to assume comprehension and focus on critical thinking. She also does a marvelous job of helping students with performing original research and promoting opportunities to publish. The one critique I have is that for such a big final project, it would have been better to start the interview process earlier in the semester. The more time students have to collect, and more importantly analyze data, the more polished the final reports can be.

The instructor made sure we were supported in our learning of the material, and was ready with any assistance needed throughout the course, both in and out of class.


Professor Hartel was readily available to help with our coursework along the way.

Professor Hartel made it very easy to contact her inside or outside of class for support on our final project. The time taken in class to share and hear feedback from our peers was also appreciated!












E-1. The course instructor (<u>Jenna Hartel</u>) provided opportunity for classroom discussion.
